Sacramento Guitar Society Offers FREE Youth Group Guitar Classes at Five Sacramento Public Libraries

Sacramento Guitar Society fills the void of music education in schools by offering free, afterschool Guitar "Struminars" for youth ages 8-18 at five public libraries – thanks to its members, donors, and the California Arts Council's Youth Arts Action Grant Program

SACRAMENTO, CA – The <u>Sacramento Guitar Society</u> announces its "<u>Strum for Fun</u>" group guitar lessons at five (5) public libraries in Sacramento County with grant proceeds from the California Arts Council's Youth Arts Action Program. The Sacramento Guitar Society will use the funds received from this grant, plus an equal match from the organization's donors and members, to pay local guitar teachers to teach a the selected libraries.

These youth-led, walk-in "Struminars" are a perfect place for young library patrons ages 8 to 18 to learn their favorite songs each week. The focus is on having fun and learning to play the guitar while meeting others with the same interest. No pre-registration is required. Students are encouraged to bring their own guitars, but loaner guitars will be available to those who do not have one of their own.

The free sessions are offered weekly from September 2019 thru May 2020 at the following libraries:
